After hop test, Chandrayaan payloads on sleep mode
Next awakening on September 22

After a successful hop test where the Vikram lander was elevated and soft landed again on the Moon, ISRO on Monday said it has exceeded its objectives and now its payloads have been switched off. The test will help scientists in future Moon missions where samples could be brought back to Earth and more importantly help the human missions being planned, ISRO added.

"Vikram soft-landed on the moon, again! Vikram Lander exceeded its mission objectives," ISRO added. After the successful hop test, Vikram and Pragyan payloads are now in a power-off mode until the south pole of the lunar surface is back in the range of the Sun again. ISRO said that Vikram will fall asleep next to Pragyan once the solar power is depleted and the battery is drained. The space agency said it was "hoping for their (Vikram and Pragyan's) awakening, around September 22, 2023."

Elaborating on the experiment, ISRO's update said the importance of the experiment is to help in future missions where samples from the Moon's surface can be brought back to earth for further analysis. The hop test can also help in the human missions as it confirmed ISRO's ability to 'kick-start' the lander once again days after touching down on the lunar surface. ISRO scientists said that after the Vikram lander carrying the Pragyan rover landed on the Moon, various experiments were conducted and the hop test was the latest. It was not announced earlier but it is one of the tests that helped the Chandrayaan mission exceed its objectives, ISRO said.

ISRO sources said that the payloads and ramp of the lander were folded back before performing the hop test. Further, it was elevated by firing its engines and making it hop once on the lunar surface. "On command it (Vikram lander) fired the engines, elevated itself by about 40 cm as expected and landed safely at a distance of 30 to 40 cm

Now, NEET aspirant hangs self in Sikar

After a spate of suicides in Kota, another student ended his own life in Sikar, another emerging coaching city in Rajasthan, on Monday. A medical aspirant hanged himself in his hostel room in the district. Kausahal Kumar was preparing for the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test or NEET medical exam. The police said Kausahal, 16, a resident of Raison in the state's Karauli district, was preparing for the NEET in the institute located on Piprali Road. He had been staying in Veer Tejaji Boys Hostel since April 23, 2023. He came from coaching classes at 12 pm on Monday and went straight to his room after having lunch.

Boy dies in school, kin allege foul play

A 16-year-old schoolchild died by suicide in Kolkata on Monday, police said. According to police, the student of a reputed English medium school jumped from the fifth floor of the building on in the afternoon. The parents of the dead boy, however, blamed the school administration for abetting the suicide of their son. Talking to the media, the deceased boy's father said his son was harassed because he formed a group and protested against the authorities for fee hike during the Covid pandemic. "My son was heckled in front of other students as he failed to submit a project report. He had been mentally tortured by the school administration for a couple of years as I was one of the protesting parents against the fee hike during the pandemic situation," the father said, adding, he was initially informed his son rolled down the stairs. When he reached the school, he was told his son had committed suicide by jumping from the fifth floor of the school building. The body was sent for the autopsy. All attempts to contact the school went futile.

It is happening for the first time that the elderly can vote from their homes, besides there will be wave casting at 50 per cent of booths, so that the EC can keep an eye on any abnormal situation prevailing in any booth.

Innovations being done in polls: Anupam Rajan
According to chief election officer of Madhya Pradesh Anupam Rajan, several innovations are being done in the ensuing election. It is happening for the first time that the elderly can vote from their homes, besides there will be wave casting at 50 per cent of booths, so that the EC can keep an eye on any abnormal situation prevailing in any booth. new electors will vote this year. Similarly, the facility for casting one's vote from home, which was provided during the by-polls, will be carried out this time. If the citizens above 80 years wish, the polling officials will visit their homes to help them cast their votes. Such a facility is being given to the elderly for the first time. The physically challenged people who cannot reach polling booths can also cast their votes from homes.

Lioness gives birth to 2 cubs in UP safari, 1 dies

After a series of animal deaths, a lioness gave birth to two cubs at the Etawah Lion Safari, but one died shortly after. While the lioness, named Rupa, was reported to have given birth in an open area frequented by visitors, the safari administration denied the claim and said the cubs were born at a breeding centre. Previously, the administration believed that the lioness was not pregnant as samples sent to a lab in Bareilly did not confirm the pregnancy. Safari director Deeksha Bhandari said the first cub was born at 4.26 p.m. Sunday and the other at 4.53 p.m. "One of the cubs is dead and the other is healthy and kept at the natal care unit in the Safari."

Girl ends life as her morphed video is posted online
BAREILLY: A girl committed suicide by consuming poison after a man allegedly uploaded a morphed video of her on social media, police said on Monday. The incident happened on August 15 at an inter-college located in Devaraniya police station area when students were celebrating Independence Day, they said. According to police, the students were recording video of the events when accused Shavez Rizvi (19) made a video of the minor girl, morphed it and later uploaded it on social media.
